COVID-19: Coronavirus control plan: autumn and winter 2021 update

The Welsh Government's have confirmed Wales will remain at Alert Level 0 for the next three weeks. The Coronavirus Control Plan has also been updated. To read the announcement go to:

COVID-19: COVID Pass for events and nightclubs

From Monday 11 October 2021, people will be required to show the NHS COVID pass to demonstrate they are either fully vaccinated, or have had a recent negative Lateral Flow Test, to enter nightclubs and larger events.
