Clocaenog Forest Wind Farm Fund: Business Grants Launch 17 May 2021

Clocaenog Forest Wind Farm is an onshore wind farm project owned by RWE. It is built on land leased from the Welsh Government that is managed by Natural Resources Wales. As part of the project, there will be an investment of £19 million over 25 years for communities within the area of benefit in Conwy and Denbighshire counties, and part of south-east Gwynedd is also in the Area of Community Benefit.
