Leaving the EU: Letter from the Minister for Economy, Transport and North Wales, Ken Skates

The Minister for Economy, Transport and North Wales, Ken Skates, has issued a letter to assist businesses which are not yet fully prepared for changes which will occur and affect business operations from 1 January 2021. In brief the letter outlines the support available to businesses to assist them through the EU transition period and beyond. The grant is being extended from 1 November 2020 and is available in the form of two grants, each available for three month periods covering November 2020 to January 2021 and February 2021 to April 2021. Update: Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Schemes and Future Fund – close end of January 2021

The four temporary loan schemes that were designed to support UK businesses that are losing revenue and seeing their cashflow disrupted as a result of the COVID-19 outbreak close on 31 January 2021 for new applications.

- Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CBILS)
- Coronavirus Large Business Interruption Loan Scheme (CLBILS)
- Bounce Back Loan Scheme (BBLs) – From 10 November 2020, participating lenders in the Bounce Back Loan Scheme (BBLs) are able to offer smaller businesses across the UK a ‘top-up’ to their existing Bounce Back Loan if they originally borrowed less than the maximum amount available to them.
