FUNDING: ERF Business Support – December 2021 to February 2022 now open

The second of the three funds to support retail, hospitality, leisure and tourism businesses – and their supply chains – to deal with the impact of the Alert Level 2 restrictions is now open.

The Economic Resilience Fund (ERF) is administered by Business Wales and will support eligible businesses with a pre COVID-19 turnover of over £85,000, who employ staff and who anticipate a reduction of 50% or more in their turnover between 13 December 2021 and 14 February 2022. Businesses receiving the NDR Emergency Fund can also apply to the ERF. All applications to the ERF must be submitted before midday on 1 February 2022. For more information, go to:
