FUNDING: Retail, leisure and hospitality to receive 50% non-domestic rates relief in 2022-23

As part of the Welsh Government's Draft Budget proposals for 2022-2023 yesterday, 50% non-domestic rates relief for the duration of 2022-23 was announced for retail, leisure and hospitality ratepayers in Wales (capped at £110,000 per business). To read the statement, go to:

COVID-19: Latest Information and Guidance

Last Friday the Welsh Government announced the following changes to the Coronavirus regulations:

Employers now have a legal duty to allow their employees to work from home if possible and employees are required to do so where practicable

From 27 December 2021:

- There will be a new set of reasonable measures for businesses and services, including a new rule on 2m social distancing. Shops, businesses and workplaces will need to make changes, including extra measures, such as one-way systems and physical barriers
- Nightclubs must close

In addition, the Welsh Government announced last night that sporting events in Wales will be played behind closed doors from Boxing Day. To read the announcement, go to:

BREXIT: Get a goods movement reference

From 1 January 2022, hauliers will need to use the Goods Vehicle Movement Service to get any goods that they move through a port in the UK that uses the service, through customs. Ports using the goods vehicle movement service to control goods will need pre-lodged declaration references to be linked together within a single goods movement reference (GMR).
