Restrictions update

Today's Welsh Government announcement confirmed that from tomorrow, Saturday, 27 March 2021:

- Self-contained holiday accommodation, including hotels with en-suite facilities and room service, will be able to reopen to people from the same household or support bubble.
- The stay local rule will be replaced by an interim all-Wales travel area, which will remain in place until 12 April 2021, subject to the public health situation. Travel to and from Wales will still only be allowed with a reasonable excuse, such as work during this period.
- Hospitality businesses must take all reasonable measures to minimise the risk of exposure to the virus and should not knowingly accept customers in breach of the travel restrictions.

March/April 2021 Restrictions Business Funds for businesses liable for Non-Domestic Rates, will close at 5:00pm on Wednesday, 31 March 2021. Businesses who have not already received support for the impact of the restriction over March/April can still register for support, by going to:

The February/March 2021 Discretionary Grant for businesses not liable for Non-Domestic Rates, or are ineligible for the Non-Domestic Rates grants, will also close at 5:00pm on Wednesday, 31 March 2021.
