2017/18 Work Programme

A number of strategic economic and regeneration schemes are already in operation by the Council and partners in Meirionnydd and these will continue to be implemented and they have been included in the Work Programme.

At the same time we need to be proactive with bespoke schemes to respond to the challenges identified and to new opportunities.

The financial position over the next period will be challenging, but there are also opportunities, including diverting schemes and maximising relevant national and regional expenditure for the situation in Meirionnydd.
