

In 2021, Cyngor Gwynedd Regeneration Board agreed to develop a new Regeneration Framework. The intention of the Framework is to ensure that proactive steps are in place to ensure collaboration to improve the areas economically, environmentally, socially and culturally.

As part of that Framework, the county has been divided into 13 Local Regeneration Areas and an action plan has been created for each of the areas. This is the action plan for the Pen Llŷn area.

'Regeneration' has been defined as a deliberate effort to improve areas economically, environmentally, socially or culturally. The framework also recognises a key role for communities to identify local priorities; and the contribution of local organisations in developing action plans.

After an engagement process in 2022 and listening to the opinions of local people, the plan includes the vision and priorities of each community for the future. With working in partnership at the core of the arrangements it is hoped that it will provide a clear path to steps that can bring positive change to communities that will change lives for the better. The aim of the plan is therefore to be a guide to investment locally as well as influence on policy decisions in all areas - from health and education to transport and planning.

'OUR AREA' ENGAGEMENT

The purpose of the 'Our Area' (Ardal Ni) project was to hold a conversation and discuss with local communities in order to identify what is important to residents and how they would like to see their area develop over the next 10-15 years



Consultation and engagement with each community has been a key part of drawing up the action plans. There were three stages to the consultation held under the banner of 'Ardal Ni 2035'

- An initial discussion was held with town and community councils together with local organisations, groups and councillors receiving 17 responses on ideas about what should be the local priorities for the area in the period up to 2035. These responses were used as a basis for the second stage of wider engagement with the public.
- Due to deep concern about the decline of the Welsh language, the Llŷn Community Councils have all designated the area as an Area of higher density linguistic significance. The result is that "Plans to maintain and strengthen the Welsh language", has been added to the list of priorities of the Local Regeneration Plan, Pen Llŷn Area 2035.
- A public engagement campaign was organised to give residents the opportunity to voice their opinion regarding the challenges facing their area, what is important to them and what developments they want to see in their area over the next 10 to 15 years . 359 responses were received from the Pen Llŷn area through an online and paper questionnaire
- Following public sessions, workshops were held with organisations to discuss action plans focusing on the issues and priorities that had been identified locally.

The Pen Llŷn Area is located in the Western part of the County, the coastal and rural features of Pen Llŷn are central to it. The Area includes the communities of Nefyn, Llanengan, Botwnnog, Aberdaron, Llanbedrog and Thudweiliog.

Pen Llŷn Area Summary in Figures

Strengths

Compares better with the average of Wales or Gwynedd

- **85.3** - women's life expectancy, higher than the Welsh figure of 82.3
- **81.7** - male life expectancy, higher than the Welsh figure of 78.3
- **1.29** - (rate per 100) anti-social behavior recorded by the Police which is lower than Gwynedd's figure of 2.52 and Wales 2.55
- **78%** - percentage of the population aged 26-64 who are economically active which is higher than the Welsh figure of 75%
- **68%** - who can speak Welsh which is higher than the figure for Gwynedd (65%) and Wales (19%)
- **10%** of people in income deprivation which is below average

Weaknesses

Does not compare as well as the average of Wales or Gwynedd

- **13.5%** - 4-5 year old children who are obese which is higher than the Welsh average of 11.8%
- **82.9%** - percentage of adults with a qualification which is lower than the Gwynedd average (83%) but higher than Wales (80%)
- **4%** high value jobs lower than Gwynedd (11%) and Wales (13%)
- **30%** of houses are holiday homes, which is higher than the Welsh average (3%) and the Gwynedd average (11%)
- **21.1%** - percentage of the population living with a long-term illness or disability that is higher than 20.5% for Gwynedd

What is good about the area?

- The natural environment and convenience to mountains, seaside and countryside (285)
- It is a safe area (215)
- The Welsh language and culture (183)
- The area's ability to attract tourism for economic benefit (152)
- Heritage and history of the area (147)
- Quality walking and cycling routes and the Coastal Path (126)
- Community spirit and camaraderie, social activities and community facilities (111)
- The area is clean and tidy (96)
- Local produce and businesses in the area (84)
- Facilities such as shops, cafes and restaurants (82)

What is not good about the area?

- Lack of suitable and affordable housing for local people to buy or rent (176)
- Lack of high paying and full time jobs (165)
- There is a high number of second homes and holiday homes in the area (154)
- The public transport network in the area is insufficient (115)
- Lack of provision and activities for young people (108)
- Poverty and high living costs are a problem in the area (105)
- Concern locally about the provision of health and welfare and care in the area (104)
- There is concern about roads and parking in a number of locations (92)
- Broadband and internet connection are poor (85)
