Working with the Head teacher of Eifion Wyn we were able to get the council to put measures in place to try and tackle the Seagull problem at the school.
- I have continued with my voluntary work in the community.
- I am Vice Chair of Caru Port and thankful to everyone involved with the Christmas lights and the Hwyl yr Harbwr summer activities.
- I am on the Wylan committee and have secured new income for the community paper.
- I am still a member of the Marie Curie fundraising group who have raised thousands of pounds this year.
- I am pleased to be involved with the Dementia Go project. A recent evening with Beti George was a big success in raising awareness of the condition.
- Meet regularly with local police officers and PCSO to discuss concerns of Porthmadog people about, for example, drugs and speeding in the town.
- Member of Cartrefi Cymunedol Gwynedd Board and regularly raise local issues with them.
