**Subject :** To approve a Standard Charge of **£581.28** for 2017-18.

### **Recommendation for the Decision :**

To approve a Standard Charge of **£581.28** for 2017-18.

### **Reason why Decision is needed :**

Section 59 of the Social Services and Well-being (Wales) Act 2014, allows the Council to impose a charge for the provision of care and support, including residential care. The Charging Policy for Adult Care and Support Services, proposing that the Council uses its discretion under the Act and impose a charge for residential care unless the resident's financial circumstances permit the Council to contribute towards the cost of their care, was approved by the Cabinet on 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2017. The Code of Practice (Part 4 and 5) of the Act states in the event that the Council imposes a charge, that charge must be reasonable, and no higher than the actual cost to the authority of providing that care.

The purpose of this report is to set a standard charge for care provided within the Council's residential homes during the financial year 2017-18, and in accordance with the Act.

### **Reason and justification behind the Decision :**

The Standard Charge is based on an estimate of the cost per bed per week.

The table below shows an estimate of the full cost of the Council's residential homes for 2017-18.

It is foreseen that there will be 315 registered beds available in 2017-18. The current average occupancy rate is 89.5% (compared to 88.2% that was used to calculate the Standard Charge for 2016-17).

The estimated effect of price inflation on the standard charge is a £3.03 increase but the estimated effect of the rise in the occupancy rate is a decrease of £8.73.

A Standard Charge may be set by individual home, by different services or on average over all homes. By now, some Council run homes provide specialised services for individuals with memory impairment (EMI) and a Standard Charge could be set separately for these.

The table below shows the cost per bed per week by home on the basis of an occupancy rate of 88.2%) and on the basis of an occupancy rate of 89.5%). The average cost is £584.31 and £575.58 respectively.

If the Standard Charge were set on a per home basis (see above table), some individuals would face a very substantial increase in their weekly charges. If it were set by service type, some individuals in receipt of EMI services would face a weekly charge of up to £718.67 (on the basis of the true cost of Plas Maesincla). It is not, however, believed that either of these options would be fair to the individuals so affected.

It is therefore proposed that one Standard Charge be set on the basis of the average cost for all homes and that the latest trend in occupancy is reflected in the calculation. As the 2016-17 charge (£581.28) is within the range from £584.31(88.2%) to £575.58 (89.5%), ***it is recommended that the Standard Charge remains set at £581.28 for 2017-18.***

**Chief Executive –**

As the Head of Finance confirms, the Cabinet Member has very little flexibility in this matter. I do not have anything to add to the recommendation.

**Head of Finance –**

I support the recommendation to approve continuance of the standard charge at £581.28 again for 2017/18 (no change). The Cabinet Member's options in this matter are limited, as the Council must raise a standard charge reflecting the average cost. Since last year, as the notice explains, the costs have increased with inflation, but as the number of residents has also increased, the level of charge can be kept constant.
