Hornet robberfly has been recorded from less than forty sites in Wales.

### 1.3 Status in Gwynedd<sup>c</sup>

Recent records on the Llŷn are restricted to Cors Geirch although there are historical records from Nefyn and Mynydd Cilan.

# 2. FACTORS AFFECTING THIS SPECIES IN GWYNEDD

- Loss of unimproved grassland and heath leading to habitat fragmentation.
- Use of worming treatments for stock e.g. avermectins, which inhibit the development of dung beetle larvae.
- Change in stock management from a mixed system (cattle & sheep) to mainly sheep.

#### 3. ASSOCIATED GWYNEDD SAPS / HAPS

Lowland heathland, Lowland dry acid grassland, Lowland meadows and pasture

### 4. CURRENT ACTION IN GWYNEDD

#### 4.1 Site and habitat protection

Cors Geirch is an SSSI, and part of it is also an NNR.

### 4.2 Management and programmes of action

- Cors Geirch SSSI is being managed sympathetically for this species.
- Hornet robberfly is one of the species eligible for funding from Countryside Council for Wales Species Challenge Fund.
