[1] Action Point S9/PG11 – Monitoring Framework

Work with Welsh Government to strengthen the monitoring framework. In relation to development linked to the Wylfa Newydd project – identify indicators linked to key stages in the project's delivery.

[2] Action Point S13/PG7 – Monitoring Framework

Collaborate with the Welsh Government to ensure that the Council is able to monitor the success or otherwise of the Council to provide permanent sites in a timely manner, and to measure whether a transit site is required or not during the Plan period.

[3] Action Point S16/PG1 – PG39: Monitoring Framework

During Hearing Session 16 a series of action points were set, which provided the Councils with an opportunity to further refine the Monitoring Framework included in Chapter 8 of the Plan. A schedule of the relevant action points is provided in the Examination Library.

[4] Councils' Response

4.1 Appendix 1 provides a copy of the proposed Matters Arising Changes to Chapter 8 of the Plan, which includes the monitoring framework.

[5] Action Point S1/PG3 & Action Point S16/PG42 – Plan's format

Review the Plan to ensure that strategic and detailed policies do not repeat the same matters – are some strategic policies surplus to requirements? In addition ensure that criteria in some policies are not unnecessarily repeated in other policies. There may be an opportunity to consider this matter in a separate hearing.

Consider making amendments to the Plan:

- (i) Edit the Plan to remove reference to 'Deposit';
- (ii) Set out the Plan's end date;
- (iii) Streamline parts of the Plan and delete sections that include information that is no longer required;
- (iv) Refine criteria to reduce repetition;
- (v) Edit the Plan to ensure consistency in terminology, e.g. settlement boundary and development boundary used;

(vi) Move SLA boundaries and Mineral Safeguarding Areas from Constraints Maps to Proposals Maps

Present Matters Arising Changes to cover the tasks described above.

[6] Councils' Response

- 6.1 The Councils have considered the above Action Points and wish to propose a number of amendments to address the matters. Examples of the Matters Arising Changes include the following:
- i. Delete the Executive Summary as it is no longer required at this stage;
 - ii. Delete sections within Chapter 2, which, for example, describe stages in the plan preparation process;
 - iii. Re-arrange policies in Chapter 7.4 in order to improve flow of information, etc
 - iv. Delete criteria in specific policies to avoid unnecessary repetition;

- 6.2 These Matters Arising Changes are included in a schedule which will be subject to public consultation shortly.
