CYNGOR GWYNEDD BUDGET 2026/27

Foreword by Cabinet Member for Finance and Head of Finance

Firstly, we would like once again this year to thank all relevant staff for the work of producing Cyngor Gwynedd's 2026/27 budget, and all the Members who contributed to the process. The draft budget was given consideration by a majority of Council members at a briefing on the financial position and the 2026/27 budget held on 27 January. Further detailed discussions then took place at the meetings of the Governance and Audit Committee, Cabinet and Full Council in setting this budget.

When the Welsh Government's draft budget was published in November 2025, Cyngor Gwynedd was among 10 local authorities in Wales that took advantage of a settlement 'floor' which saw us receive a 2.3% increase for 2026/27; without this floor we would have received significantly less. By the time the final settlement was announced, following a budget agreement between the Welsh Government and Plaid Cymru, Cyngor Gwynedd has received a 4.1% increase in its settlement for 2026/27 (after the base for 2025/26 was adjusted in drawing up the settlement). Therefore, the Council is in a stronger position in 2026/27 than originally predicted. In updating the Medium-Term Financial Plan for 2026/27 to 2028/29, we had considered a range of factors and assumed that the settlement to Cyngor Gwynedd will increase by 1.5% per annum. So, in that respect, the draft settlement was significantly better than what we had feared.

The result of the better-than-expected settlement is that permanent bids with a total value of £9.9 million can be funded. Again, particular attention is paid to the services that show constant overspending over several years, which suggests that the budget provision was inadequate.

The total additional spending requirements considered in the final budget, after considering the value of the permanent bids, is £23.14 million. Included in this figure are salary inflation of £8.3 million and further inflation of £6.1 million in addition to the permanent bids referred to above.

After taking into account increases in Government Grant and Additional Spending Requirements, there was a gap of £115.9 million, which is being filled through a combination of Council Tax and the implementation of savings determined in previous years.

As a result of savings plans approved in previous years, £254k of savings were available to fill the 2026/27 gap. Consequently, there is a residual gap of £115.7 million to be filled from Council Tax, which means an increase in Council Tax on individual households by 5.17% (which includes a 0.42% increase for the Fire and Rescue Authority). This is a weekly increase of £1.90, or £98.62 annually, with Band D tax of £2,006.11 for 2026/27.

In general, there have been prudent assumptions when considering risks about specific grants, inflation, and income levels, while we have carefully reassessed our ability to achieve savings. When papers for the full Council meeting on 5 March 2026 were published, the subsequent budget was a fair estimate of the Council's spending and income needs for 2026/27. However, at the time of writing this preface, we do not know what the impact of war in the middle east will be on inflation rates and the economy for the coming year or in subsequent years. The situation will be kept under ongoing scrutiny by us, drawing on external expertise as necessary to give us the most accurate picture possible, and we will take such steps as necessary to protect the Council's position.





Gwynedd Council is the Lead Authority appointed by the Welsh Government (WG) to manage the North and Mid Wales Trunk Road Agent (NMWTRA). The Agent is a Partnership consisting of the 8 north and mid Wales Unitary Authorities.

NMWTRA is responsible for managing and maintaining the trunk road network and associated assets which extend to 1174 km of road network (with 199 km within Gwynedd) and approximately 2000 highway structures including the A55 Tunnels as well as all aspects of the WG highway Intelligent Transport System (ITS).

Work carried out by the Agency includes all aspects of trunk road maintenance and improvement, civil engineering, design and supervision.

The Agency also has responsibility for managing on behalf of the Welsh Government the Traffic Wales Service (TWS) on an all of Wales basis which includes the Traffic Wales Communications Service, the North Wales Traffic Management Centre and all aspects of WG ITS as well as the Traffic officer Service in the north Wales region.

The Agent is also appointed by Welsh Government as Departmental representative to administer the Private Finance Initiative contract for the A55 across Anglesey.

NMWTRA staff are located (285) at a number of sites across its network area including: Wrexham (5), Halkyn (46), Conwy (94), Bangor (85), Llandygai (7), Dolgellau (3), Aberaeron (13), Newtown (7) and Llandrindod Wells (25).

The agent typically expends £70m - £90m on an annual basis on behalf of WG.

All the Agency costs are recovered from Welsh Government.

THE CAPITAL BUDGET 2026/27

Capital expenditure involves the provision of new assets for the Council, or the substantial improvement of assets which will be of benefit for a number of years. Also, the Council provides various grants, mainly to the private sector to improve Gwynedd's housing stock.

Capital expenditure can be financed from four sources; borrowing, grants and contributions, capital receipts and revenue.

Borrowing

The prudential system for local authority capital finance was introduced on 1 April 2004. Its legislative base is contained in the Local Government Act 2003 and the regulations subsequently made by the Welsh Government enable local authorities to determine their own levels of affordable borrowing. Therefore, under the prudential system, authorities have to decide for themselves how much they can afford to borrow based on a prudent assessment of their capital expenditure requirements. There is a duty for each authority to set an affordable borrowing limit in advance of each financial year, and to monitor their position against the limit and ensure that it is not exceeded. However, the Welsh Government does announce, as part of the annual settlement, a figure which represents the borrowing level, which is supported within the Revenue Support Grant, the unhyponothecated supported borrowing.

The Council borrows most of the money to finance schemes from the Public Works Loan Board and repays it with interest over a number of years.

Grants and Contributions

As part of the annual settlement the Welsh Government allocates a general capital grant. For some capital schemes, the Council receives specific grants and contributions from Welsh Government, Central Government and other bodies.

Capital Receipts

A receipt arising from a disposal is defined as a capital receipt if the authority were the buyer in such a transaction, expenditure on the acquisition of the asset would be classified as capital expenditure – the “mirror principle”. A capital receipt is defined as such if the total proceeds from a disposal are more than £10,000.

When the Council sells assets which are surplus to requirements, the whole amount may be used to finance General Fund capital schemes.

Revenue

The Council may also spend part of its revenue budget or balances on capital schemes.
