# Nomination pack for candidates who are standing at a local government in Wales (Community Council only)

This nomination pack is for use by candidates who are standing at a community council election in Wales

The following papers must be delivered to the Returning Officer by hand or electronically:

1a: Nomination paper

1b: Home address form

The following papers can be delivered by hand, electronically or by post:

2: Certificate of authorisation

3: Request for a party emblem

The notice of election published by the Returning Officer will specify the place and times that nomination papers may be hand delivered and the arrangements for delivering nomination papers electronically.

If you deliver your nomination paper by hand, you must submit the **original signed version** of each completed paper.

If you deliver your nomination paper electronically, you should **only send it to the email address supplied by the Returning Officer.** 

#### **General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR)**

Data protection legislation applies to the processing of all personal data. Please contact the <u>Information Commissioner's Office</u> for further information about how the General Data Protection Regulation affects you.

You should point out to the person who witnesses your nomination what the information on the form will be used for and how personal data will be processed and kept secure. The lawful basis to collect the information in this form is that it is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest and exercise of official authority as set out in Representation of the People Act 1983 and associated regulations.

You should also explain that the information will be shared with the Returning Officer. For further information on data protection and data processing you should refer to the Returning Officer's privacy notice on their website.

# Local government election: candidate checklist

This checklist is designed to assist candidates standing in a community council election<sup>1</sup> in preparing to submit their nomination, and should be read alongside the Electoral Commission's Guidance for candidates and agents.

Whatever you enter in this box will appear as your description on the ballot paper.

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#### 2: Certificate of authorisation

To accompany the nomination of a candidate standing on behalf of a registered political party. (Note: candidates standing on behalf of two or more parties require a certificate from each party).

This certificate must be issued by the registered Nominating Officer of the party or by a person authorised to sign on their behalf.

This certificate authorises the candidate to use a specific registered description or the name of the party as registered with the Electoral Commission, or to use 'any registered description or the party name as registered with the Electoral Commission'.

This authorised party name or description can then be included by the candidate on the nomination form. It is this which will appear as their description on the ballot paper. Party names and registered descriptions are listed on the Electoral Commission's website (http://search.electoralcommission.org.uk).
