

The effects of a loved one going to prison can have a great impact on children, the FABI Project is looking at the following areas to enable children and young people access to support as quickly as possible.

1. By Identifying children and young people in a timely manner, to offer support.
2. By working with education staff to educate about FABI and to undertake awareness training, and identifying FABI Champions.
3. By providing tool kits to any agency regarding FABI.
4. By raising awareness of FABI within the communities of North Wales.

We are aware that relatives going to prison, especially a parent, could have an impact on finances, housing, carers roles, safety, health, education and employment, if you are a family that requires support in this area please contact Karen Brannan the Regional Officer for FABI – Families affected by imprisonment.
