
Our Area 2035 Results of the Public Engagement Exercise (February – June 2022)

Bangor Area.





1 Introduction


- 1.1 The aim of the Our Area 2035 Project is to hold a discussion with local communities in order to identify what is important to residents and how they would like to see their area develop over the next 10 15 years.
- 1.2 Our aim is to work together and develop solutions with organisations, groups and individuals. At the end of the project 13 specialised regeneration plans will be created to reflect the priorities and aspirations of local communities.
- 1.3 The first step to the project involved holding conversations with Councillors, Community and Town Councils and local regeneration groups in order to establish:
 - What is good about the area?
 - What is not so good about the area?
 - What changes would you like to see happen in the area in the next 15 years, that would make the area a better place to live?
- 1.4 12 Community/Town Councils, organisations, groups and local Members in the Bangor Area presented their ideas regarding what should be the local priorities for the area in the period up to 2035. These responses were used as a basis for the second stage of wider public engagement.
- 1.5 In February 2022 a public engagement exercise was launched for each of the 13 areas, with local people being invited to contribute to the shaping of the Our Area 2035 project by filling in a simple survey online or on paper.
- 1.6 In order to encourage as many people as possible to participate, a comprehensive engagement campaign was organised, which included:
 - Press releases and a radio item;
 - Advertisements in the local papers;
 - Information leaflets;
 - Messages and videos through social media;
 - Prominent messages on the Cyngor Gwynedd website home page;
 - Attending the North Wales Pride event in Bangor.

- 1.7 In addition, a series of visits and face to face meetings were organised to hear the voices of groups and individuals that are seldom heard. These included:
 - GISDA Blaenau Ffestiniog A discussion session with members of the Young People Board and a session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
 - GISDA Caernarfon A discussion session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
 - GISDA Pwllheli A discussion session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
 - Dementia Actif Gwynedd, Barmouth- A discussion session after the physical exercises.
 - Dementia Actif Gwynedd, Dolgellau A discussion session after the physical exercises.
 - Dementia Actif, Nefyn A discussion session after playing Boccia at Tafarn yr Heliwr.
 - Dementia Actif, Caernarfon A discussion session after the physical exercises.

2 County Overview


- **3,776** individuals across Gwynedd took the opportunity to have their say:
 - 3,675 of these completed the online survey.
 - 10 completed the paper survey that was available in libraries, 'Siop Gwynedd' or by phone request.
 - 6 completed the 'Easy read' version of the survey.
 - 85 people attended face to face sessions for young people, young people in the LGBT+ community, older people and people living with dementia.




3.1 Overview of the Respondents to the Public Survey for Bangor Area


3.2 The Our Area 2035 survey for Bangor Area received **344** responses.












6 What is not to good about the Bangor Area?

6.1 The table below lists the themes prioritised by Community/ City / Town Councils, organisations, groups and local Members of the Bangor area. As part of the public engagement consultation, the residents of the Bangor area were invited to choose up to 5 themes that they agreed with the most.

6.2 In response to the question 'Note anything else that is <u>not so good</u> about the Bangor Area that isn't mentioned above', 151 additional comments were received from the residents of the Bangor Area. A number of these additional responses offered further comments about the themes above e.g. comments about the high-street (n=23), concerns about parking, road conditions and traffic (n=18), comments about the local economy in general (n=16), housing issues (n=15) and concerns about Health, Welfare and care (n=8).

Of the comments that noted something else, these were the most popular themes:

The appearance/untidiness of the area in general e.g. problems with dog mess, litter, graffiti, the condition of buildings and the lack of green spaces.	36

 - 7.1 The table below lists the themes prioritised by Community/ City /Town Councils, organisations, groups and local Members of the Bangor area. As part of the public engagement consultation, the residents of Bangor Area were invited to choose up to 5 themes that they agreed with the most.

7.2 In response to the question 'Note anything else you think isn't mentioned above', 104 additional comments were received from Bangor residents. A number of the additional responses offered further comments about the above themes e.g. Develop plans to meet the needs of young people of the area (n=10); Plans to develop and regenerate the High Street (n=7); Plans to organise and promote more events such as fairs locally (n=6); Plans to maintain and develop public footpaths and cycle paths (n=6); Plans to keep communities of the area clean and tidy (n=4); A greener area – more renewable energy schemes, reducing plastic use, setting up car charging points, tree planting schemes etc (n=4).

Of the comments that noted something else, these were the most popular themes:

Plans to create high value jobs and attract companies/businesses to the area	10
Plans to provide houses for local people to buy and rent	8
Tackling traffic, driving and parking problems e.g. in upper Bangor	8
Plans to improve public transport	6

8 Next steps

- 8.1 During the autumn, all the feedback we have received from the residents and organisations of the Bangor area will be considered during workshops with local organisation as part of work to develop Local Action Plans.
- 8.2 The Action Plan will seek to incorporate the projects and activities of a wider range of organisations that contribute to the improvement and regeneration of the Bangor Area.
- 8.1 As part of the Regeneration Framework, arrangements will be set in place to monitor and co-ordinate the implementation of the Action Plan, taking into account existing working arrangements and partnerships.
- 8.4 The timetable for the next steps are:
 - Workshops with Local organisations : October / November 2022
 - Draft Action Plans prepared : March 2023
 - Comments and additions received to the draft document : April 2023
 - Revised Action Plans prepared : April / May 2023
 - Monitoring and co-ordination arrangements in place: May 2023
