
# Our Area 2035 Results of the Public Engagement Exercise (February – June 2022)

#### 1 Introduction


- 1.1 The aim of the Our Area 2035 Project is to hold a discussion with local communities in order to identify what is important to residents and how they would like to see their area develop over the next 10 15 years.
- 1.2 Our aim is to work together and develop solutions with organisations, groups and individuals. At the end of the project 13 specialised regeneration plans will be created to reflect the priorities and aspirations of local communities.
- 1.3 The first step to the project involved holding conversations with Councillors, Community and Town Councils and local regeneration groups in order to establish:
  - What is good about the area?
  - What is not so good about the area?
  - What changes would you like to see happen in the area in the next 15 years, that would make the area a better place to live?
- 1.4 15 Community/Town Councils, organisations, groups and local Members in Bro Ardudwy presented their ideas regarding what should be the local priorities for the area in the period up to 2035. These responses were used as a basis for the second stage of wider public engagement.
- 1.5 In February 2022 a public engagement exercise was launched for each of the 13 areas, with local people being invited to contribute to the shaping of the Our Area 2035 project by filling in a simple survey online or on paper.
- 1.6 In order to encourage as many people as possible to participate, a comprehensive engagement campaign was organised, which included:
  - Press releases and a radio item;
  - Advertisements in the local papers;
  - Information leaflets;
  - Messages and videos through social media;
  - Prominent messages on the Cyngor Gwynedd website home page;
  - Attending the North Wales Pride event in Bangor.

- 1.7 In addition, a series of visits and face to face meetings were organised to hear the voices of groups and individuals that are seldom heard. These included:
  - GISDA Blaenau Ffestiniog A discussion session with members of the Young People Board and a session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
  - GISDA Caernarfon A discussion session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
  - GISDA Pwllheli A discussion session with members of the GISDA LGBT+ Club.
  - Dementia Actif Gwynedd, Barmouth A discussion session after the physical exercises.
  - Dementia Actif Gwynedd, Dolgellau A discussion session after the physical exercises.
  - Dementia Actif, Nefyn A discussion session after playing Boccia at Tafarn yr Heliwr.
  - Dementia Actif, Caernarfon A discussion session after the physical exercises.

## 2 County Overview


- **3,776** individuals across Gwynedd took the opportunity to have their say:
- 3,675 of these completed the online survey.
- 10 completed the paper survey that was available in libraries, 'Siop Gwynedd' or by phone request.
- 6 completed the 'Easy read' version of the survey.
- 85 people attended face to face sessions for young people, young people in the LGBT+ community, older people and people living with dementia.




#### 2.2 Overview of the Respondents to the Public Survey for Gwynedd




























## 3.1 Overview of the Respondents to the Public Survey for Bro Ardudwy.


3.2 The Our Area 2035 survey for Bro Ardudwy received **273** responses.












5.2 In response to the question 'Note anything else that <u>is good</u> about the Bro Ardudwy area that isn't mentioned above', 58 additional comments were received from the residents of Bro Ardudwy. A number of the additional responses offered further comments about the above themes e.g. The natural environment, nature and fresh air (n=13); community spirit and friendliness (n=5); The area's ability to attract tourism for economic benefit (n=3).

Of the comments that noted something else that is good about the area, the most popular themes were:

6.1 The table below lists the themes prioritised by Community/ Town Councils, organisations, groups and local Members of Bro Ardudwy. As part of the public engagement consultation, the residents of Bro Ardudwy were invited to choose up to 5 themes that they agreed with the most.

6.2 In response to the question 'Note anything else that is <u>not so good</u> about the Bro Ardudwy area that isn't mentioned above', 109 additional comments were received from the residents of Bro Ardudwy. A number of these additional responses offered further comments about the themes above e.g. Problems relating to parking, road conditions and traffic in many parts of the area, with many who specifically mentioned Llanbedr bypass (n=18); Litter, untidiness and general look of the area is a problem, with many noting dog mess as an issue (n=11); The public transport network in the area is inadequate (n=9); Concern about the area's health, well-being and care provision (n=6).

Of the comments that noted something else that is not so good about the area, the most popular themes were:

A number of the additional responses offered further comments about the above themes e.g. Schemes to secure high value work and jobs (n=7); Barmouth harbour improvements (n=4); Plans to develop Llanbedr Airfield site (n=3); Plans to develop a public transport network that is accessible, integrated and suitable for the local needs of the area (n=3).

Of the comments that noted something else about the area, the most popular were:

#### 8 Next steps

- 8.1 During the autumn, all the feedback we have received from the residents and organisations of the Bro Ardudwy area will be considered during workshops with local organisation as part of work to develop Local Action Plans.
- 8.2 The Action Plan will seek to incorporate the projects and activities of a wider range of organisations that contribute to the improvement and regeneration of the Bro Ardudwy area.
- 8.3 As part of the Regeneration Framework, arrangements will be set in place to monitor and co-ordinate the implementation of the Action Plan, taking into account existing working arrangements and partnerships.
- 8.4 The timetable for the next steps are:
  - Workshops with Local organisations : October / November 2022
  - Draft Action Plans prepared : March 2023
  - Comments and additions received to the draft document: April 2023
  - Revised Action Plans prepared : April / May 2023
  - Monitoring and co-ordination arrangements in place: May 2023

#### What is good about Bro Ardudwy?

- Dragon Theatre.
- A lot of activities going in.
- The beach.
- Good area to live.
- Friendly people and community spirit.
- Good shops.
- Plenty of places to go for food and good variety.
- Dyffryn and Llanbedr village hall.
- Allotments opened in Dyffryn, place for the public to buy freshly grown fruit and vegetables.
- Good community council.
- Air cadets Llanbedr.

#### What is not so good about Bro Ardudwy?

- A lot of the shops are closed.
- Toilet facilities often closed.
- Second homes.
- The grass doesn't get cut often enough
- Gutters are full it's often the community that has to unclog them to avoid floods.
- No facilities for young children.
- The money that's produced from the car parks should be fed back directly to Barmouth community.
- Perception of a lack of police presence.
- The hospital is far away.
- Poor CCTV.
- Concerns about anti-social behaviour and vandalism.
- No development regarding the relief road in Llanbedr.
- There is often maintenance on the trains during the time pensioners are allowed to travel for free, they often loose a month or two of traveling.
- No buses run late in the afternoon or at night.
- The train stations aren't accessible e.g. the Llanbedr train station is very far away to walk
- Concerns about access to banks.

## What changes would you like to see happen in the Bro Ardudwy area in the next 15 years, that would make the area a better place to live?

- Swimming pool
- Tenpin bowling
- Make the Leisure Centre in Abermaw (Barmouth) easier to find there's a feeling it isn't easy to find at the moment. Would also be nice if it was open on the weekends.
- Bilingual signs
- Something being done about the sand from the beach that collects on the footpaths and surrounding areas
- A development plan to improve the Barmouth prom
- Provide more facilities for younger people
- More opportunities for volunteering.
