1.Remember to arrange to get your chimney cleaned.


2. Arrange to have someone over to check your heating system and boiler.



More money in your pocket

Anyone can fall behind on bills, but it is never too late to ask for help. Here is some information about the grants, payments, and financial support available to help you.

Important things to remember:

- Claim the benefits that you're entitled to. Call Advicelink Wales on 0808 250 5700 (free help line) or go to the <u>government's website</u>.
- Contact your suppliers / creditors to discuss your concerns if you are having trouble paying your bills.
- Be careful/wary of <u>scammers</u> and <u>loan sharks</u>.



Pension Credit

Pensions Credit provides extra money to help you with living costs if you are over the State Pension age and on low income.

You may be eligible for additional support if you are a carer, disabled, or responsible for a child or young person. Pension Credit is separate to your State Pension.

You are eligible for Pension Credit even if you have another income, savings or if you own your own home.

Other support if you receive Pension Credit:

If you receive Pension Credit you are also eligible for additional support, such as:

- Housing Benefit if you rent the property you live in.
- Cost of living payments.
- **Support for Mortgage Interest** if you own the property you live in.
- Council Tax Discount.
- **TV licence** for free if you are 75 years of age or older.
- Help with **NHS dental treatment, glasses, and transport** costs for hospital appointments, if you receive a specific type of Pension Credit.
- Help with heating costs through the Warm Homes Reduction Scheme.



Council Tax Discounts

Are you eligible to pay less Council Tax?

- If you are eligible for Credit Pension.
- If you live on your own, you have the right to a 25% discount on your Council Tax.
- Severe Mental Impairment.
- Caring for someone.
- Disability.

If you live in Gwynedd and believe that you could be eligible for a Council Tax discount or reduction, you should **contact the Gwynedd Council Tax department: 01286 682689.**

Social Tariffs



Broadband and phone packages

Social tariffs are cheaper broadband and phone packages for people who claim Universal Credit, Pension Credit and a few other benefits. Some providers call them 'essential' or 'basic' broadband. If you, or someone in your home, claim Universal Credit, you can switch to any one of the available tariffs. The person receiving the benefit must be the main person on the contract. How to apply?

First, check to see if your current provider offers social tariffs. It is possible to apply for most tariffs on-line, or by calling your provider and asking to switch.

HelpU Tariff – Welsh Water



Do you live on low income? The HelpU tariff helps low-income homes by capping the amount you have to pay for your water.

Do you live on your own, or do you not use much water? You may be able to save money by setting up a water meter.

Is your home's income less than £50,000 a year? Is your expenditure higher than your income? You may be eligible for 3 months of free water through the Community scheme.

If you have received or are awaiting your next cost of living payment or £301 from the Government, you may be entitled to save up to £200 on your annual water bill as well.

Keeping Warm

Even if it's not a hard winter, cold weather can make us more likely to be ill.

- • Try wearing multiple layers of clothing instead of one thick layer.
- Try using a hot water bottle or an electric blanket in bed
 do not use both at the same time.
- • Try not to sit still for more than an hour if indoors.
- •Keep your bedroom window closed throughout the night since this is the coldest time of the day.
- • Close your curtains during the night to keep in the heat.
- If it has been over a year since you serviced your heating system, you should ask a professional worker to check that it works efficiently throughout the winter.
- •Some energy suppliers have a Priority Services Register that provides advice and additional support to older people during the winter.

Warm Spaces
