

If you have ever considered making a difference by supporting people in their communities, Academi Gofal Gwynedd is perfect for you.



Basic Requirements

Successful candidates will need a GCSE grade C or equivalent in either Welsh or English.

We welcome applications from anyone who is motivated, has a kind and caring nature and wants to make a difference to the lives of others.

You will need to show that you are a sensitive, honest and reliable person with the ability to act in a manner that respects the rights of the individuals at all times and demonstrates a willingness to develop.



It is desirable for successful candidates to have a GCSE Mathematics grade C or above or be willing to work towards the qualification by the end of the 3rd year of the programme.

No previous experience required but it can be advantageous.

How about coming to us for work experience, volunteering, or part-time work? Details on how to arrange this can be found in the package.

Welsh is the main language of Cyngor Gwynedd. You are required to be able to communicate confidently through the medium of Welsh or show a willingness to take advantage of opportunities to develop your language skills. Training is offered to learn Welsh and to further develop your Welsh language skills, across all levels.



Children and Supported Families

The Children and Supporting Families department provides various Social Care services for the residents of Gwynedd.

The department's purpose is to ensure that the children and young people of Gwynedd are protected from harm; experience stability in their life and have the best health and well-being opportunities.

There are several teams within the Children and Supporting Families department. The department works within 3 tiers of need;

- 1. Early Intervention,
- 2. Care and support, safeguarding, and care needs
- 3. Specialist Teams.

In Gwynedd, we believe that every child and young person should be given the opportunity to reach their full potential. We recognise that children develop best when they are supported to grow and succeed within their families and communities. We also recognise that providing early intervention is critical in helping children and their families to thrive and to reduce the need for more intensive services.

The Adults, Health, and Well-being Department provides a range of Social Care services for Gwynedd residents who require advice, information, support, or care due to specific needs.

The Adults, Health and Wellbeing department provides a large number of different services to support the residents of Gwynedd. A small but very important percentage of the services provided are our residential homes, day services, and home care. The objective of our internal services is to provide a service to enable, support and promote people to live fulfilling lives as independently as possible. The department focuses on the user's life, offering a flexible service, completely person-focused based on quality and emotion. The department will promote the individuals who use the service to have a voice, control and choice over their own lives and the services they receive.

The department's purpose is to enable the adults of Gwynedd to 'live my life as I wish'.

Learning Disabilities Team


The Learning Disabilities services fall under the Adults, Health and Wellbeing department.

The purpose of the services is to address and promote the well-being needs of individuals with learning disabilities. Whether that be physical, emotional, mental, or social needs. It is necessary to ensure that the services address what is important to individuals with a learning disability and their carers.

To ensure that the needs of individuals are fully met, a wide range of services will often be offered in partnership. This can be support to live independently, support out in the community, and much more.

The Learning Disability service focuses on the provision that offers opportunities to socialize and maintain relationships. There is a focus on developing a community-based service through the local hubs and offering a service that is led by the individuals and their carers.

The Learning Disabilities field is so diverse. It is an opportunity to gain experience and skills to improve your understanding of how to support individuals with complex and intense needs. There is great scope for development in the field.

Qualification Opportunities!



Level 2 Health and Social Care Adults

This qualification consists of 5 units:

- Principles and Values of Health and Social Care
- Health and Well-being
- Professional practice as a Health and Social Care worker
- Safeguarding individuals
- Health and Safety in Health and Social Care

Once the core is completed you will move on to the practical part of the qualification. As a Care worker, you will work towards a level 2 qualification. After discussing with your mentor, you will then be able to decide which units to choose, depending on which you have enough evidence to complete.





Level 2/3 Health and Social Children and Young People

This qualification consists of 5 units:

- Principles and Values of Health and Social Care
- Health and Well-being
- Professional practice as a Health and Social Care worker
- Safeguarding individuals
- Health and Safety in Health and Social Care

Once the core is completed, you will move on to the practical part of the qualification, which will be on a level 3. After discussing it with your mentor, you will be able to decide which units to choose, depending on which you have enough evidence to complete.

In order to become a Registered Manager you must complete the Health and Social Care qualification at level 4 and 5.

Level 4 Preparing for Leadership and Management- The qualification consists of the following units

- Legislation, theories, and models of Person/child-centered Practice
- Theoretical Frameworks for Leadership and management in Health and Social Care
- Leadership and Management of effective team performance in Health and Social Care services

Once the core is completed you will move on to the practical part of the qualification which will be level 5. After discussion with your mentor, you will be able to decide which units to choose depending on which you have enough evidence to complete.







Occupational Therapist

Occupational Therapy aims to improve a person's ability to do meaningful, everyday tasks if an individual is experiencing difficulties.

Occupational Therapists work with people of all ages to look at all aspects of everyday life in their home, school, or workplace. They look at activities that they find difficult and see if there is another way to do them. Often, they will make assessments on individuals who come home from the hospital, for example, seeing what adjustments need to be made to the home for the patient to live a comfortable life e.g. putting in a stairlift, arranging for a wheelchair to be available, etc.

Several Occupational Therapy teams in Gwynedd serve adults, children, and individuals with learning disabilities across the county. We can place you within a team most convenient for you.

To become an Occupational Therapist, you need to complete a 4-year part-time degree through Wrexham University. The degree will be fully funded by the Academi.



Social Worker

Social Workers make a difference to the lives of individuals and their families to help them live their lives more successfully.

As a Social Worker, you will work with people to find solutions to their problems. This can mean giving individuals a voice, protecting vulnerable people from harm, and supporting people to live independently. There are several different Social Work teams within the Council including - children's teams, adult teams, learning disability teams, and a mental health team.

To become a Social Worker, you will need to complete a degree through the Open University. This will be fully funded by the Academi.

The degree is a 3- year degree. There will be two steps to complete the qualification.

Step 1: Apply for the first year of the degree

Year 1 - Foundations for Social Care and Social Work Practice

Step 2: Apply for the 2nd and 3rd year of the degree (it is not necessary for you to do this immediately after finishing the first year)

Year 2 - The law within Social work/ Contemporary Social Work Practice Year 3 - Critical Social work Practice along with a choice from Mental Health/ Health and Social Care/ Management and Leadership/ Young Lives



General questions

Is there an age limit to apply?

There is no upper age limit, but you do need to be 17 or over to apply for these posts.

I already have a degree, am I eligible?

Yes - we accept applications from those who have already been through higher education, however each applicant will have to follow the Academi's learning framework.

Do I have to pay education fees back?

All courses and qualifications you are enrolled on as part of Academi Gofal Gwynedd are paid for in full by the Council.

What if I do not want to do all the qualifications?

Throughout your time on the Academi Gofal you will be supported to reach your key milestones ensuring you can progress on to the next qualification. If you decide at one of these key milestones that you do not wish to progress any further, then we will support you to look for a full-time job within the Care sector relevant to the qualification level gained.

Why do I need an All Wales Induction Framework for Health and Social Care (AWIF)? You need to have completed the All-Wales Induction Framework for Health and Social Care (AWIF) as part of the registration to work as a Social Care worker in Wales. Induction framework for Health and Social Care.

What if I do not pass a level?

You will be supported by a mentor at your work placement as well as being supported by the Academi's Co-ordinator. Your mentors will support you every step of the way to ensure you reach your full potential.

Do you support people with disabilities?

Yes, we are an equal opportunities employer, with support available to help you achieve your career goals.

What is the duration of the programme?

The length of the programme will depend on the career path you decide to take. You will have a contract for at least the first 3 years of the programme.

Am I guaranteed a job at the end of the programme?

Every possible effort will be made to ensure that every successful candidate has an opportunity to accept a job at the end of the programme.

Do you need experience in the specific field before being able to apply for the position? No, no prior experience is required. You will need to demonstrate that you are a sensitive, honest, and reliable person with the ability to act in a manner that respects the rights of the individuals at all times and demonstrates a willingness to develop.

Where will the job location be?

Opportunities are available across the county, we will try to place you as close to your home as possible. You are required to spend time in Caernarfon during the induction period and to travel for development days.


Read the job description and person details carefully you will need to use the information given here to successfully answer your application.
