A story about a young girl whose mother is a wheelchair user.

*Boots for a Bridesmaid – Verna Allette Wilkins

A story about Max and Amy's trip to a leisure park with Dad who is a wheelchair user.

* Catherine's Story – Genevieve Moore, Karin Littlewood (see also West Syndrome)

A picture-book about Catherine, who has learning disabilities. Catherine has West Syndrome

Friends at School – Rochelle Bunnett

Different abilities in young children are celebrated by emphasising the importance of inclusion from a child's perspective. A book aimed at young children.

Having a Disability – Louise Spilsbury – An inclusive and accessible picture book for children that explores what it is like to have a disability

* Letang and Julie save the day/ Trouble for Letang and Julie – Beverley Naidoo. Stories about friends. One is a wheelchair user.

*Perfect - Nicola Davies

A story which opens up the subject of disability and is about a boy who struggles to accept his new born sister, when she is not what he expected. 5+

* Ringo the Flamingo – Neil Griffiths

Picture book about Ringo who was born unable to fly but still turns out to be a hero.

*Seal Surfer – Michael Foreman – A boy learns to surf, and forms a special friendship with a seal that he and his grandfather watched being born. There is no mention of the boy's disability in the story, but the illustrations clearly show crutches and a wheelchair.

*Susan Laughs – Susan uses a wheel chair. She laughs, sings, flies, swings. She's good, bad, happy and sad. In fact, Susan is no different from any other child..

Two Left Feet – Jenny Sullivan

Sadly, Bryn won't be allowed to climb the castle walls like the other children because he uses a frame with wheels to help him walk. But he's determined to make the very best of this special day.

We Can Do It – Laura Dwight

Meet five special children who all have a certain disability.

Using a Wheelchair – Angela Royston, Heinemann

Introduces young readers to conditions and disabilities that may affect them, or friends and family.

Alzheimer's & Dementia

*Grandad's Hat – Matt Elliott

Grandad can't remember where he put his hat and needs help finding it. A story designed to help very young children learn about some of the symptoms of dementia in a positive and engaging way. Published by Alzheimer's Research UK.

Oscar loves Grandma, but as time passes, she becomes less able to look after herself, and has to go to a care home. A tale about the experience of dementia.4+

Lenny loves his grandpa, King Lion, but is worried when the king starts getting muddled and forgetful. A moving tale of the loving bond between grandparent and grandchild, which transcends dementia.

*Mile High Apple Pie – Laura Langston – Picture book about a young girl's relationship with her granny who has Alzheimer's.

*Really and Truly: a story about dementia— Emilie Rivard

Before Grandpa got ill, his stories could always cheer up Charlie. But now Grandpa can't remember all those old stories. 7+

When Grandma Came to Stay – Matt Elliott

Grandma doesn't look sick but she is starting to forget important things so needs someone to help take care of her. This touching short story explores the experiences of a child who has a family member living with dementia. Published by Alzheimer's Research UK. 8+
