

# School Re-organisation Y Gader Catchment 2014








Consultation with children and young people (Secondary)





Perhaps you've heard that Gwynedd Council are trying to change (reorganise) the structure of education in the Gader catchment, but what does this mean to you as a pupil?

# 1. Why change (re-organise)?

Gwynedd Council has decided to change (re-organise) schools in the Gader catchment in order to:

Improve education standards
Improve building condition e.g. new windows
Make better use of resources e.g. IT equipment
Ensure a good education system for the future
Decrease surplus spaces in schools
Provide schools which are important to the comminuty
Strengthen the Welsh language
Have adequate sized classrooms


## 2. How does change (re-organisation) work?

Gwynedd Council have considered a number of different options whilst discussing the reorganisation process in the Gader catchment.

Following considering several options, Gwynedd Council have developed ONE option ('proposal') - to create all through catchment area school for pupils aged 3-16 years

Before implementing any proposal the Council must "Consult" upon it, thus providing an opportunity for everyone to present their opinion, including children and young people.

## 3. What is being proposed in the Gader catchment?



#### This means:

- Close every school in the catchment
- Establish an all through catchment area school Welsh medium, community for pupils aged 3-16 in the Gader catchment
- The schools will be on six sites; namely the present sites of:
  - 1. Dinas Mawddwy
  - 2. Ieuan Gwynedd (Rhydymain)
  - 3. Cynradd Dolgellau
  - 4. Friog
  - 5. Llanelltyd
- The Secondary sector will remain on the current Ysgol Y Gader site
- ONE Head and ONE Governing Body will be responsible for running the school (primary and secondary)
- As part of this proposal every site will be improved

Developing an all through catchment area school will help to:

- > Provide fair experiences for every child
- > Improve education standards
- > Provide equal opportunities for all
- > Provide opportunities to share expertise
- > Create stability in the area
- > Provide career opportunities for staff
- > Provide opportunity to improve services

The Council feels that this proposal will stregthen education in the area for the future.



## 4. How you can respond?
