Schools



Every school will open on 29 June. The term will end on 27 July.

Less children will go to school every day. They will be taught in small groups.

The schools will contact the families of children and young people to tell them what will happen

There is still help available on Hwb Dysgu. Click the word Hwb to go there.

Further education colleges (College Llandrillo Menai) will also start teaching people face to face from 15 June. They will only do this for some people.

The college will contact you if it affects you.

Buses



Some buses have stopped.

You have to look at the bus timetable to see which buses are still going.
You can see the timetables by clicking on the picture of the bus.

Collecting bins and recycling carts



The bins are being collected as usual but sometimes they do not arrive on time.

If they have not been able to empty your bin you should leave it out. They will empty it as soon as they can.

It is possible to order a new bin or recycling crate in the usual way.

If you want bags for a brown bin put out a note for the bin men or women.

Please make sure you put the right things in the right bins and that the recycling is clean.

If you can, please clean the handles of the bin to make sure that the bin men or women are kept safe. Please do not put tissues in the recycling bin. Put them in a bag in the green bin.

If there is someone in the house with coronovirus (COVID-19) do not put the bins out for 14 days.

Recycling centres



Almost all recycling centres in Gwynedd have now opened again. Garndolbenmaen recycling centre has not opened yet.

You have to phone to arrange a time (slot) before going there. The number is 01766 771000.

You can arrange a time (slot) through the Gwynedd Council website as well.

Do not go to the Recycling Centre if you are feeling ill.

Home care service



The Council will make sure that the people who need home care most will get it first.

But we will do our best to give home care to those who need it.

We are asking families and friends to help people as much as possible during this time.

Social workers



The service is still available. The social worker will see if they need to come and see you or if there is another way to help you.

Care homes for older people



You cannot go to see people in a care home.

Blue Badges for disabled people



If you need a new blue parking badge during this time you will have to fill in the form online. To do this click on the blue badge picture.

Housing



If you are a tennant in a social housing house and need help with problems with money you should talk to your landlord.

A tennant is someone who pays rent

If you are the tennant of a private landlord then you should talk to your landlord first.

The births, deaths and marriages registration service



The work of this service is to make a record and give a certificate when a baby is born, when a couple get married and when someone dies.

A certificate is an official paper

The service does not give out birth certificates at this time.

Usually you have to have a birth certificate to get child benefit or universal credit. You do not have to get one during this time.

There are no weddings happening at this time.

If someone has died you must phone 01766 771000 so that a record can be made.

Libraries



Libraries are now working in a different way.

If you want a book, DVD or anything else from the library you have to order first.

You can arrange to go to get the book you have ordered from the library. Or you can arrange to bring it to you

Only 6 libraries are open but the service will be available for everyone.

The libraries that are open are:

- Caernarfon Library
- Dolgellau Library
- Pwllheli Library
- Tywyn Library

Bangor Crematorium



The Council cleans the crematorium between every funeral.
