What is an Emergency?

There are many types of emergencies

A few of the more common ones are:



Flooding

If you live in a flood risk area do what you can now to prepare for a flood. Draw up a flood plan checklist that spells out what actions you can take if you get a warning that your property could be flooded. Don't wait until it happens, you may not have time.

Severe weather

Storms, gales, heatwaves, snow and ice.



Power and water cuts

Gas, phone or electric failure due to storms or severe weather, accidentally being cut off by supplier, strike action, water supply failure or contamination.



Industrial accidents

Gas explosions, chemical leaks, large fires or nuclear incident.

What you can do to prepare for an emergency

Take time to find out:

- ▶ Where and how to turn off water, gas and electricity supplies at home
- ▶ How your family will stay in contact
- ▶ If an elderly or vulnerable neighbour may need your help
- ▶ How to tune in to your local radio station

Prepare an Emergency Grab Bag:

- ▶ This leaflet
- ▶ First Aid Kit
- ▶ Radio, torch and spare batteries
- ▶ Candles and matches
- ▶ Bottled water
- ▶ Tinned food for 3 days and can opener
- ▶ Snacks
- ▶ If you have particular dietary needs make sure you take the right foods, e.g. gluten free.
- ▶ Pet food and carrier
- ▶ Toiletries and regularly prescribed medication
- ▶ Spare clothes and blankets
- ▶ Spare keys
- ▶ Copies of important documents e.g. house and content insurance, passport, driving licence

In the unlikely event of an emergency

- ▶ Keep calm
- ▶ Think before you act
- ▶ Tune into your local radio and tv station and listen to the advice of the emergency services



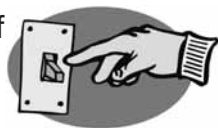
What to do if you are evacuated

- ▶ Pick up your emergency grab bag.
- ▶ Gather cash, mobile phone, credit cards and keys



If there is time:

- ▶ Take warm clothing for everyone
- ▶ Make sure fires are out and all appliances and equipment are switched off
- ▶ Shut all windows and lock your property
